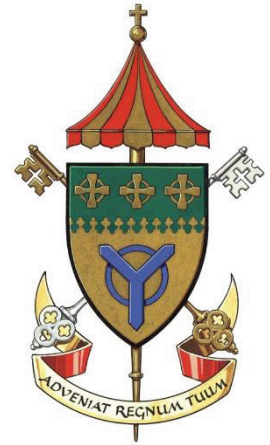

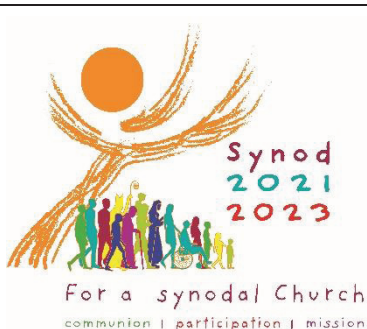

### Meditations on Holy Mass Corpus Christi (Year C)

**First reading:** Genesis 14.18-20 CCC 58, 1333, 1544  
*Melchizedek brought out bread and wine.*

**Second reading:** 1 Corinthians 11.23-26 CCC 1339

*As often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the  
Lord's death until he comes.*

**Gospel:** Luke 9.11b-17

*All ate and were filled.*

In the *first reading*, from Genesis, we hear that we our gratitude to  
God ought to be constant. In this the sacred author anticipates *the  
Gospel*, in which St. Luke tells of Christ's superabundant  
generosity to all. In doing so, St. Luke prefigures the bread from  
heaven that is the Saviour's own body, broken for us. In  
the *second reading*, St. Paul tells us that we have a duty to hand  
on the same Faith that we have received from the  
Apostles. As *the Sequence* reminds us, "This the truth each  
Christian learns: bread into his own flesh Christ turns." The  
Apostles knew the Lord's divinity only by faith in Jesus. Now only  
by faith in the Eucharist do we know both the Lord's humanity and  
his divinity.

**Before Mass:** *Lord, how good you are and how gentle is your  
spirit. When you wished to show your goodness to your sons you  
gave them bread from heaven, filling the hungry with good things  
and sending the rich away empty. (First Vespers)*

**After Mass:** *I am the living bread come down from heaven;  
anyone who eats this bread will live for ever, alleluia. (Lauds)*

**Later in the day:** *How holy is this feast in which Christ is our food;  
his passion is recalled; grace fills our hearts; and we receive a  
pledge of the glory to come, alleluia. (Second Vespers)*

Message from the Rector

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), celebrating the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the elements (consecrated bread and wine) of the Eucharist. Two months ago, the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper was observed on Holy Thursday in a sombre atmosphere leading to Good Friday. The liturgy on that day also commemorates Christ's washing of the disciples' feet, the institution of the priesthood, and the agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. The feast of Corpus Christi was proposed by St. Thomas Aquinas, Doctor of the Church, to Pope Urban IV, in order to create a feast focused solely on the Holy Eucharist, emphasizing the joy of the Eucharist being the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. The feast is liturgically celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday or, "where the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is not a holy day of obligation, it is assigned to the Sunday after the Most Holy Trinity as its proper day" – which is the case in Canada. (Source: Wikipedia) At the end of our Sunday 12:15 PM Mass, there will be a procession of the Blessed Sacrament. The procession will be followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in the church. The procession will take place outside proceeding counter clockwise around the block. In the event of inclement weather, the procession will be inside the church.

This year, the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, normally celebrated on June 24<sup>th</sup>, is impeded liturgically by the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is celebrated on the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost which, this year, is Friday, June 24<sup>th</sup>. As a result, the observance of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (Special Patron of French Canadians) will take place on Thursday, June 23<sup>rd</sup>. The World Day of Prayer for Priests coincides with the feast day of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Begun by Pope St. John Paul II in 2002, the Day of Prayer asks the Catholic faithful to join in prayer for the sanctification of priests. As has been said, the Church does not need priests. She needs holy priests!
